








Are we patient and loving with one another and willing to be flexible in order to help each other participate in corporate discernment?




Are we committed to practices that help everyone participate in Meeting for Business?




If a member of our community had a serious problem or joyful life event, would the rest of us know about it? How?

Have we found ways in which all members of our community, regardless of physical location, can both give and receive pastoral care?













Have we come to a sense of the meeting about whether our status as a hybrid or virtual meeting is temporary or permanent?




















Do we understand the ways in which various committees' responsibilities may have changed if we shifted from an in-person community to virtual/hybrid?
